Current certification standards require all training hours must be obtained with the trainer (TEP and/or PAT) present in the room with the trainee. The Board has received several inquiries about permitting distance learning for training hours credit. The Board of Directors is exploring what types of distance learning might be adequate for training hours, what areas of competency might be taught via distance learning and what areas, if any, should not be taught by distance learning. In addition, the Board will need to decide how many, if any, hours of training might be obtained via distance learning. Please note that any changes in the certification standards can only occur after the membership has approved them.

Please remember that all Primary, Secondary & 3rd Endorser recommendations must be based on observations (twice) within the current three years of the application date.
